In this brief essay, the author counters arguments made by Catholic ethicists in support of sex reassignment surgery. He argues that Catholic hospitals should not practice sex reassignment surgery.

George, Robert P. Body-Self Dualism in Contemporary Ethics and Politics. New York: Cambridge University Press, 2009.

For a much longer and in-depth treatment of dualism, this is an excellent source by a preeminent philosopher of our time.

May, William. Sex, Marriage, and Chastity: Reflections of a Catholic Layman, Spouse, and Parent. Chicago: Franciscan Herald Press, 1981.

Though this book is excellent, it does not speak directly to transgender issues. The first chapter, however, sets out very clearly the differences between the dualist (or separatist) anthropology and the integralist (Christian) anthropology.

These authors dedicated their entire careers as psychotherapists to specializing in children dealing with gender dysphoria. This book, which is a product of their work, is not an easy or quick read but certainly is a valuable reference book for any who want to go deeper into this topic.
